Use this guide to help you decide whether or not the web pages you are viewing are reliable sources for research. Need help? Ask your librarian!

Author	Based on the information you found about the author, rate this source:
Who is the author? Can't find a name? Look at the top and bottom of the page. Click through other pages on the site to see if an author is listed.	<input type="checkbox"/> Credible <input type="checkbox"/> Not Credible
What makes the author an expert on this topic? What do you learn about the author's occupation, years of experience, education, or other facts that make them an expert?	
What connections does the author have? List any connections the author has to a university, research laboratory, government agency, or other reputable organization related to the topic.
